The whole school indicated 370 students proficient in ELA-subtest reading informational text, 386 students proficient in ELA-subtest reading literary, and 326 students proficient in Science-subtest reasoning on LEAP 2025

#### WEAKNESSESS:

The whole school indicated 398 students weak in Social Studies subtest civics (ALSO, B, W, H, SWD, ED), 107 students weak in Math subtest ratio and rate (ALSO, B, W, H, SWD, ED), and 314 students weak in ELA subtest written expression (ALSO, B, W, H, SWD, ED) on LEAP 2025.
